9-DAY NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT IN PREPARATION FOR PENTECOST

DAY-3: "THE NAME, TITLES SYMBOLS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT "

1. INTRODUCTION - The Church has received the name Holy Spirit from 'Rua" – 'breath of God' and professes it in Baptism – "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". The name Spirit means breath, air, wind. This is the image Jesus used when speaking to Nicodemus: "Truly, truly, I say you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

We all have been baptized and received a "share in the divine nature" (2 Pt 1:4), Still we fail to let this divine nature grow in us. Often we give way to the "works of the flesh", described by St. Paul in Gal 5: 19-21 (Read). Being aware of our resistance to the "Breath of God", the Holy Spirit, let us ask pardon:

A few like Simeon and Anna wait in hope for the "consolation of Israel" (Lk2:25) and "the redemption of Jerusalem" (Lk 2: 38). During Jesus' public life even his own disciples were looking forward to a political figure who would bring the kind of freedom and fulfillment they longed for.

In this age of Technology and material progress, what are our expectations? In what do we place our hope? Our experience tells us that violence and injustice still flourish. In whom do we trust to rid us of all these troubles? They cannot lead us to fulfilment. Do we not have to ask ourselves whether there is any difference between us and those who do not believe? Today we begin by asking pardon for our lack of faith and trust in God and his Word.

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PENTECOST
