#### INTRODUCTION

Each year the Committee of Divine Worship of the Apostolic Vicariate of Northern Arabia (AVONA) publishes the Liturgical Calendar for AVONA. This calendar is used by authors of ordines and other liturgical aids published to foster the celebration of the liturgy in the four countries of the Vicariate.

The calendar is based upon the General Roman Calendar, promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI on February 14, 1969, subsequently amended by the Holy See, and the Proper Calendar for the AVONA, approved by the Apostolic Vicar of Northern Arabia, His Excellency Bishop Aldo Berardi O.SS.T. This calendar has been updated to reflect the names and titles of the various liturgical days in conformity with the Roman Missal, Third Edition and the relevant liturgical festivities of the vicariate.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal reminds us that in the cycles of readings and prayers proclaimed throughout the year in the sacred liturgy "the mysteries of redemption are celebrated so as to be in some way made present." Thus, may each celebration of the Holy Eucharist which is served by this calendar be for the Church in the Vicariate "the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit."

The cycles given above have been used in the preparation of this calendar. The readings from the Proper of Time and Proper of Saints have been used for all Solemnities and Feasts since they must take the place of the weekday readings for those respective days. The readings from the weekday cycle generally are to be used even on days on which a Memorial or Optional Memorial of a Saint occurs. The exceptions to this rule are the Memorials or Optional Memorials which have "proper readings" (usually only the Gospel) assigned to them in the *Lectionary for Mass* and which must be used on those days. Substitutions from the Commons or Proper of Saints may be made for the other readings suggested for those Memorials or Optional Memorials. The Priest Celebrant, however, should not omit "too often or without sufficient cause the readings assigned for each day in the weekday *Lectionary*"

(Introduction to the Lectionary for Mass, no. 83). In this calendar, Optional Memorials are designated by the use of italics within brackets.

The Scripture citations and Lectionary numbers for all readings are from the Lectionary for Mass for Use in the Vicariate of AVONA, and the Lectionary for Mass Supplement (2017), which are based on the Ordo Lectionum Missæ, edition typica altera (1981), as emended. The spellings of the names of Saints and Blesseds are from the Roman Missal, Third Edition (2011), based on the Missale Romanum, editio typica tertia emendate (2008).

#### MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

Scripture citations are based on the New American Bible with the revised New Testament and may differ slightly from the citations given in the Ordo Lectionum Missæ (1981) due to difference in versification.

2. In the preparation of diocesan and provincial calendars and ordines, the dedication of diocesan cathedrals, the dedication of parish churches, and special days of prayer (cf. General Instruction of the Roman Missal [GIRM], no. 373) should be added, along with other commemorations of Saints and Blesseds which are included in those particular calendars. More information is available in the Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, particularly Chapter II.

- 3. "On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when no Obligatory Memorial occurs, an Optional Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary may be celebrated" (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, no. 15). This is indicated in the calendar by "BVM." The readings and prayers may be selected from the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary or Votive Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Roman Missal, or in the Collection of Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- 4. The 2025 liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, December 1, 2024. During the year 2025:
  - a. Since December 8, 2024, is the Second Sunday of Advent, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred to Monday, December 9. The obligation to attend Mass, however, does not transfer. The Optional Memorial of Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, December 9, is omitted this year.
  - b. Thursday, May 29, the Easter Weekday or the Optional Memorial of Saint Paul VI, Pope is observed.
  - c. In a notification dated December 8, 1998, of the *Congregation for Divine Worship* and the *Discipline of the Sacraments* (Prot. n. 2671/98/L), the Obligatory Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary becomes an Optional Memorial in years when it conflicts with another Obligatory Memorial. Therefore, Saturday, June 28 is a weekday in Ordinary Time, as well as the Optional Memorials of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Irenaeus, Bishop, Martyr, and Doctor of the Church.
  - d. Saturday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints. In accord with the complimentary norm to canon 1246 §2.

Glory to God is used only on Solemnities, Feasts and Ritual Masses (e.g. Nuptial Mass)

Alleluia is used at all Masses. Violet vestments in Masses of the season.

**Floral decoration and use of musical instruments** should be reduced (cf. IGMR 305, 313), except on Feasts, Solemnities, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent (*Gaudete* Sunday).

**Nuptial Mass is allowed** except Sundays of Advent and Solemnities but couples should be advised to consider the nature of Advent with regard to festivity (OCM 32).

#### **LENTEN NOTES**

- **Optional commemorations** of saints other than Solemnities/Feasts.

  Colour is violet/purple. At Mass: Use collect of saint, rest as on weekday.
- **Alleluia is omitted** in all celebrations, even Solemnities. It is replaced by one of the 4 acclamations printed in the Lectionary "or another similar phrase". All Lectionary acclamations are interchangeable, even if a particular one is printed
- **Glory to God is omitted** until the Easter Vigil, except for Feasts, Solemnities and prescribed Ritual Masses (e.g. Nuptial mass).
- **Prayer over the People** for each day (weekdays: optional; Sundays: obligatory) is said after *The Lord be with you* but before blessing, with hands extended over people.
- **Preface of Lent** III and IV is used on weekdays; Preface I and II is used on Sundays, if no proper preface given.
- **Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation** may be suitable for weekdays and can be used with the Lenten Prefaces.
- **Decoration** of the altar with flowers is not permitted. Musical instruments should only be used to sustain singing, if needed.

#### LENTEN

## **Regulations on Fast and Abstinence**

- **1. Fast and Abstinence** are prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, limited to the ages between 21 to 60.
- **2. Abstinence** is prescribed as a general rule for every Friday in Lent, applicable to the age of 14 onwards. But for particular circumstances in the Vicariate of Kuwait, Abstinence is to be observed on the Wednesdays of Lent. Out of devotion Abstinence may be observed every Wednesday during the year.
- **3. Eucharistic Fast:** The faithful must abstain from solids and liquids for one hour before receiving Holy Communion. This regulation is applicable to Masses celebrated in the morning, afternoon, evening or at midnight. Water does not break the fast. Those who are sick, even though not confined to bed, may take any liquid or food as medicines at any time before Holy Communion without asking permission.

### **SCRUTINIES (Christian Initiation for Adults)**

During Lent, initiation rites are carried out for those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil, on the  $1^{\text{st}}$ ,  $3^{\text{rd}}$ ,  $4^{\text{th}}$  and  $5^{\text{th}}$  Sundays. The initiation rites are celebrated during the Mass as laid out in the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults* If, for pastoral reasons, these rites are celebrated on another day, the Mass and readings given below are still used.

**Mass:** from the 'Ritual Masses' of the Missal for the Enrollment, and 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Scrutiny. **Vestments:** violet.

Omitted: Glory to God, Alleluia.

**Preface**: proper Preface (under the corresponding Sunday of Lent).

**Eucharistic Prayer:** Commemoration always made of the godparents using the form found under the *Ritual Mass: For the First Scrutiny*.

**Readings:** from the corresponding Lenten Sunday, Year B. Additional options are given in Ritual Masses of the Lectionary.

In larger parishes, where absolutely necessary to accommodate persons, an additional 1 or 2 Masses may be celebrated by permission of the Bishop. However, the number should not be simply multiplied.

**Washing of the Feet** is optional. The number is <u>not</u> fixed at 12 persons, since the revised meaning links the ritual with charity rather than the institution of the priesthood. Participants should not wear any special vesture, especially resembling the sacred vestments.

**Procession to altar of repose** only at main/last Mass; for other Masses, any remaining hosts are placed back in tabernacle and Mass ends as usual.

**Empty tabernacle** at beginning of Mass where procession will take place; sufficient hosts to be consecrated for Communion on Holy Thursday and Good Friday.

**Bells rung** at the *Glory to God*; next used at Easter Vigil. Clapper (crotalus) may be used at Mass, transfer of Bl. Sacrament, etc.

Presentation of the Gifts: Ubi Caritas is sung.

**Eucharistic Prayer I** (3 proper insertions) encouraged and printed in full under Holy Thursday in the missal.

**Altars are stripped**, uncovered crosses are veiled/removed, and candles extinguished in front of any images after Mass.

**Blessed Sacrament is reserved** in a closed tabernacle, not exposed in a monstrance. Decorations resembling a tomb/burial place are avoided.

Adoration is conducted with solemnity up to midnight, and without external solemnity after midnight. Night Prayer may be sung and/or part of the Gospel of John 13-17 read.

#### 18 Fr FRIDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

**General absolution** in accordance with regulations.

**No sacraments** (except Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick).

Funeral must be without solemnity, music or Mass.

Other liturgical or para-liturgical services specific to Good Friday (e.g. Liturgy of the Hours, Tenebrae, Tre Ore, Seven Words, Burial Procession, etc.) encouraged.

Only presider and deacons wears red Mass vestments. Other clergy present wear choir dress (habit/cassock-surplice), do not enter in procession or prostrate. Red stoles are worn for communion and by those reading the Gospel.

**Ministers enter** in silence. Announcements, etc. before entry.

**After liturgy**, the altar is stripped. Veiled crosses are uncovered. The Cross may be placed with 4 candles on altar or another suitable place for private prayer/meditation (PS 71).

See extended online Ordo for more notes and communal Veneration of Cross.

#### 19 Sa HOLY SATURDAY

**Paschal Fast encouraged** until the Vigil (PS 39; CE 295).

**No sacraments** (except Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick).

Funeral must be without solemnity, music or Mass.

**Preparation rites for catechumens** may be celebrated in the morning (RCIA 185 ff.).

**Liturgical and para-liturgical services** should commemorate the mystery of Holy Saturday e.g. Liturgy of the Hours, 'Hour of the Mother', devotion to Sorrowful Virgin, etc. (cf. DPP 146-147; PS 73-74; IGLH 210)

**Image of Descent into Hell or Sorrowful Virgin** may be placed in church for veneration.

N.B. For serious pastoral reasons, the number of Old Testament readings may be reduced but at least 3 readings should be read, both from the Law (Readings 1-2) and the Prophets (Readings 4-7). Reading 3 and its canticle are obligatory. Resp. Pss (except Ex Canticle) can be replaced with silence.

Vigil is obligatory part of Mass. No individual/private Masses allowed.

**Images of saints** are unveiled before the liturgy.

Bells rung at Glory to God.

The *Exsultet* may be sung, if a Deacon is not present, by a (con) celebrant or (without blessing) by a lay cantor.

Night Prayer is omitted by those present for the Vigil.

N.B. Initiation: "The priest who by virtue of his office or by mandate of the diocesan Bishop baptises an adult or admits a baptised adult into full communion with the Catholic Church, also has the faculty by law to confirm that person" (Code of Canon Law 883.2). Other priests present at the Vigil should not confirm unless they have received the faculty from the bishop.

**Blessed Easter water** used to fill baptismal/holy water fonts & provided to faithful to bless homes & food.

Blessing of Easter food may take place.

#### **EASTER SEASON NOTES:**

- **Alleluia** added to Entrance and Communion antiphons, and verse-&-responses (e.g. *You have given them bread from heaven, alleluia*).
- **Blessing and sprinkling of water** is encouraged on Sundays instead of Penitential Act.
- **Paschal Candle** kept at altar/ambo until Pentecost, and lit at solemn liturgical celebrations (Sunday, Solemnities, even Feasts).
- **Regina Caeli** replaces the *Angelus* and is fittingly sung at the end of Mass.
- **Blessing of homes** (p. B22) using blessed Easter water if possible.
- **First Communion** encouraged on a Sunday of Easter to highlight baptismal/paschal character. Infant baptisms encouraged during Easter Season.
- On weekdays, the Responsorial Psalm & Alleluia may be replaced by the *Alleluia psalm* (i.e. where Alleluia as refrain, cf. IGMR 62).
