One of the most popular of twentieth-century hymns, "The Old Rugged Cross" was written by Rev. George Bennard in 1913, who also composed the tune. He wrote it after a "trying experience" had caused him to reflect seriously about the significance of the Cross. This beautiful hymn brings home the truth of the Cross to us: of God's love in the midst of pain; of His victory in the midst of defeat; of the cost of our forgiveness; and of the assurance of our salvation.

On a hill far away stood an old rugged cross, The emblem of suffering and shame; And I love that old cross where the dearest and best; For a world of lost sinners was slain.
